

“COLLEGE ADMISSIONS COUNSELING”

A Graduate Course Offered by the College of Saint Rose in Spring 2012

A unique elective is being offered once again by the College of Saint Rose for Spring 2012 that may be of interest to working counselors as well as graduate students. College Admissions Counseling, a course recommended by the National Association of College Admissions Counselors, will be available through three possible fee structures:

- Graduate students and school counselors can earn **3 graduate credits** for \$655 per credit plus fees; **OR**
- School counselors can audit the course and earn **37.5 hours** of Continuing Education for \$348 per credit plus fees; **OR**
- St Rose Alumni can audit the course and earn **37.5 hours** of Continuing Education for only \$84 plus fees **FOR THE ENTIRE COURSE!**

This course explores the college admissions process with emphasis on current issues confronting school counselors. Application and admissions criteria for various types of colleges will be reviewed along with the financial aid process. Issues around counseling the college bound student will be explored with an emphasis on college counseling for special student populations. Students will gain an understanding of the resources available to counselors in the college admissions process including print material, software, web sites and organizations. Professional, ethical and legal issues will be discussed. It will be taught by Gloria A. Jean, Adjunct Instructor for The College of Saint Rose, Past President of the Capital District Counseling Association and Government Relations Committee Co-Chair for The New York State School Counselor Association.

College Admissions Counseling is a “hybrid” course combining some online learning experiences with traditional classes to be held on-campus. Students will need access to the internet for online class sessions.
