- 1. The application form, essay, current transcript(s) and a letter of recommendation from a teacher or school counselor must be mailed or e-mailed together in one complete package.
- 2. Official transcript(s) must be the most complete and current transcript available, in a sealed envelope with a signature written across the seal. Transcript(s) must indicate a minimum 85 (3.0) average in the current academic program. Electronic transcripts will also be accepted directly from the high school or college.
- 3. Recommendation letter from a teacher or school counselor must be in a sealed envelope with a signature written across the seal. Electronic recommendation letters will also be accepted directly from the high school or college.
- 4. The application packet should be postmarked NO LATER THAN MAY 1, 2025.
- 5. Applicants must be from the Capital Region and plan to attend a Capital Region college. The Capital Region includes the counties of Albany, Columbia, Fulton, Montgomery, Greene, Rensselaer, Schenectady, and the southern part of Saratoga.
- 6. Decisions will be e-mailed to applicants in early June. The actual monetary award will be mailed directly to the college the student has indicated they will be attending by August 15, 2024.

(For Freshman applying to the First-Generation Scholarship-defined as a freshman applicant whose parents have not received a four-year college degree.) What does it mean to you to be a first-generation college student? How will receiving a college degree impact your future?

- 3. A complete official transcript(s) showing your most current grades, in a sealed envelope with a signature written across the seal. Transcript(s) should indicate a minimum grade point average of 85 (3.0) or higher.
- 4. One letter of recommendation from a teacher or school counselor, in a sealed envelope with a signature across the seal.
